<sup>1</sup> Philosophy courses that meet the CATC Thematic Core tags: PHIL 311 (HP, PI), PHIL 245 (AAQR), many Elective courses carry Thematic Core tags. A maximum of 3 Thematic Core tags can be counted both for the major and CATC requirements.

<sup>2</sup> 10-16 elective hours required. First-Year students are advised to take a 100 or 200 level Philosophy course their first semester. At least 20 of the 32 hours total hours in the Philosophy major must be taken at the 300-400 level.

<sup>3</sup> Students can choose to take the 2-credit PHIL 243 (Intro to Logic) or 4-credit PHIL 245 (Logic) to meet the requirement. PHIL 243 is the first half of the PHIL 245 class, and both are offered every semester.

<sup>4</sup> PHIL 311 and 312 (History of Philosophy) do not have to be taken in order.

<sup>5</sup> PHIL 494 (Capstone) is offered in both fall and spring semesters and should be taken in the senior year.

<sup>6</sup> Full philosophy majors are required to take at least one PHIL 454 or 455 (Historical Seminar) AND at least one PHIL 447 or 448 (Advanced Topics).

<sup>7</sup> Philosophy majors can take BITH 374: Systematic Theology instead of BITH 315: Christian Thought to meet the CATC Shared Core requirement.
