¹ Sociology courses that meet CATC tags (with max of 3 from Sociology major counting for graduation): SOC 115 (DUS, SI), SOC 251 (SI, VPAV), SOC 337 (DUS), SOC 383 (AAQR), and SOC 385 (GP, SI).

² The required core electives, which students need to take two of three (but can take all three), are offered once a year and generally in the same semester: SOC 337 Fall, SOC 347 Fall, SOC 355 Spring.

³ An Anthropology course (2 or 4 credits) and Sociology courses (4 to 6 hours) make up the 8 hours of electives for the major.

-SOC 376 Theory, SOC 383 Statistics, and SOC 482 Social Research should be done by end of junior year.

-A semester of study off-campus will require shifting around foundation sociology courses. The foundation courses are offered in these semesters: SOC 376 Spring, SOC 383 Fall, SOC 482 Spring, SOC 494 Fall, SOC 492 Spring. Please consult with your faculty advisor about potential changes to these courses.
