¹ Courses that meet CATC tags (with a max of 3 from major counting for Christ at the Core Thematic Core): ECON 211 (SI), MATH 221 (AAQR), MATH 235 (AAQR). Many of the Economics and Business elective courses carry CATC Thematic Core Tags.

² B EC 341: Principles of Marketing, B EC 342: Management, and B EC 367: Principles of Finance can be taken in any order. However, BEC 367 has a prerequisite: BEC 226, ECON 321 (or MATH 163 (transfer credit), MATH 263, or MATH 363.

³ B EC 321: Statistics (or MATH 163, MATH 263, or MATH 363) and B EC 226 Financial Accounting are prerequisites for B EC 367 Principles of Finance.

⁴ 12 credit hours of electives are required for the Business major. These are courses designated as either B EC or ECON courses.

⁵ Business and Economics students receive 6 elective credits toward the major. Elective options are offered every other year.

-Economics and B EC courses tend to fill quickly. It's very common for business majors to focus on their general education courses in their first two years and take lots of courses for their Business major in their third and fourth years. The first two years are also a good time to take supporting courses in fields like mathematics, statistics, computer science, and communications if students cannot register for first-choice Business classes.
