SIGNIFICANT LITIGATION

- 1986 Defended marine in *U.S. v. PFC John Palermo, USMC*. Members trial at Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. PFC Palermo sentenced to time served, reduction in pay grade. Defense was obedience to orders. This case, plus two companion cases formed the basis for the movie, *A Few Good Men*.
- 1987 Defended sailor in *U.S. v. HM3 Kuebler, USN*. Arson case in Washington, D.C. Judge alone trial. Acquittal based on lack of mental responsibility.
- 1986-1988 Defended CDR Dick Marcinko, SEAL, USN, at Article 32 proceeding and Flag Mast. Washington, D.C. and Naval Station, Norfolk, VA. Marcinko was the founding Commanding Officer of the Navy's pre-eminent SEAL Team.
