

# Residence Life Storage Information



## Don't be left holding a box — what to do with your stuff before you leave in May!

### Campus Storage

- Continuing students may store selected items where they live, **at their own risk**, according to the guidelines communicated by Residence Life. All storage information can be found on the residence life website. No furniture is allowed to be stored in buildings, apartments, houses, or student storage areas.
- Students who are deferring enrollment for the fall semester or studying abroad must store their items in a designated storage room in Michigan Apartments. A long-term storage email was sent from Residence Life with instructions.
- Students living in apartments must store items in plastic bins.
- Graduating students must take everything and will not have access to storage.

### Need boxes or sending packages home?

- Purchase boxes at the front desks of the residence halls. (Sale times will be posted)
- If you buy boxes from a store, Fischer and Smith-Traber use 24W x 18H x 18D. UCH uses 16W x 26L x 15H. Oversized boxes will not be stored.
- Students needing to ship boxes can utilize local UPS or Fed Ex locations. The College Post Office does not ship boxes.



### Clothing and Household donations – Give and Recycle!

- In an effort to steward our resources, Corinthian Co-op donation locations will be designated in various living areas. We will accept useable clothing, clothing accessories, coats, shoes and boots in good repair, linens (towels, sheets, blankets, comforters), household and kitchen items, working lamps, school supplies, room organizers and supplies, and books.
- Thursday, April 23rd from 3pm-5pm will be the last day to “shop” at the Co-op. **PLAN AHEAD** for your SUMMER needs.
- The Corinthian Co-op will be **CLOSED** for shopping and donations Friday, April 24th - Friday, May 1st. The Co-op will be ready to receive donations starting Saturday, May 2. Donations may be placed in the bins if the Co-op is closed or brought into the Co-op if it is open. All donations should be bagged or boxed to protect items from the rain.
- During finals week you may take donations, **IN SEALED BAGS OR BOXES**, to designated Residence Hall/Apartment locations at anytime or to the Co-op, preferably during the day.
- Apartments and houses can place donated items in the laundry rooms of Saint-Elliott and Michigan Crescent. Residents of Terrace and College Ave apartments and all houses should take their donations directly to the Co-op.
- **Please do NOT donate large pieces of furniture, chairs, non-working electronics, televisions, or large room décor.** The Co-op will accept plastic drawer organizers.

- Bicycles may not be stored outside on a Wheaton College bike rack over the summer. **Locks on unclaimed bikes outside will be cut beginning Monday, May 18.**



## Electronic donations

- E-Scrap will receive electronic donations in the lobbies of McManis-Evans, Williston, Fischer, and Smith-Traber through Tuesday, May 12 at noon. No TVs or Broken Fridges will be accepted.

## Waste disposal & Recycling

- Large dumpsters will be delivered to campus for waste disposal beginning Friday, May 1.
- **Don't throw these items out in the dumpsters next to your building: refrigerators, batteries, electronics, TVs, bicycles, couches, stuffed chairs, other large items, and toxic chemicals like oil, paint, etc.**
- Working refrigerators can be donated in the lobbies of Fischer, Smith-Traber, McManis-Evans and Williston.

## Furniture Storage, donations & disposal

**\*This year the College can no longer offer storage for couches and bigger furniture. You will need to take it home, store it off-campus, or throw it away on or before 4:00 p.m. Saturday, May 2 (unless you have a pre-approved plan with your RD). Personal furniture may not be stored in your campus storage unit. No personal furniture in summer housing!**



**\*Students will be fined \$75 if they dispose of their couches in an undesignated dumpster.**

**\*Furniture that needs to be trashed?** If you need to throw out your couch we will have 3 furniture dumpsters: 1) behind Jenks Hall, just south of the Smith-Traber parking lot; 2) against the fence in the south Fischer parking lot, 3) north of the Shalom home in the parking lot. Students will be fined \$75 for abandoning furniture around campus or in a res hall or apt dumpster.
